



RETURN TO SCHOOL 2021-2022



Welcome Back!

North Bend Central Public Schools is thrilled to welcome students back to our two buildings on August 17th, 2021. In order for the district to provide a safe and secure environment for our students and staff and comply with state and federal regulations, a number of modifications to the traditional school day are necessary. As with 2020-2021, face-to-face instruction throughout the entirety of the school year is the goal, with a premium placed on face-to-face instruction for younger learners. In order to accomplish the district's educational goals, the framework in this document will be incorporated, and periodically modified if necessary, to meet the needs associated with educating NBC students during a pandemic.

GENERAL OVERVIEW:

As within 2020, many factors will be taken into consideration when assigning an NBC building to a specific color scheme on the NBC Risk Dial such as: recent community spread of the virus, Three Rivers Health recommendations, capacity of the local health care systems, current Directed Health Measures (DHM) from governmental officials, availability of school staff, and other variables that emerge. Health and attendance of students and staff, supplies available to the district and other factors directly associated with NBC will impact the Risk Dial assessment. Contract tracing will occur as needed with both students and staff. Vaccinations are available at Medicine Man Pharmacy in North Bend. Accommodations for children with disabilities will be made as necessary.

GREEN: Low / New Normal Risk of COVID-19 Spread - Building open as usual

- **Community Definition**
 - Minimal cases of COVID within the greater community
 - COVID has minimal impact on local healthcare system
- **School Response**
 - Full attendance is required
 - Mask are optional
 - Social distancing measures in place as available
 - Lunch and breakfast will be served in cafeteria
 - Students and staff should stay home if they have symptoms

YELLOW: Moderate Risk of COVID-19 Spread - Building opened with adjustments

- **Community Definition**
 - There is a stable trajectory in numbers of COVID positive cases or percent of positive cases due to community or regional spread
 - There is limited community spread within the NBC district
 - COVID has a small impact on local healthcare system capacity
- **School Response**
 - Full attendance is required
 - Mask are optional
 - Social distancing measures in place as practical
 - Lunch and breakfast will be served in cafeteria with social distancing as practical
 - Students and staff should stay home if they have symptoms

ORANGE: High Elevated COVID-19 Spread Risk - Possible modified use of school facilities

- **Community Definition**
 - There are increasing or high stable numbers of COVID positive cases OR percent of positive cases due to the community or regional spread
 - There is an increase in flu-like symptom COVID cases in the school district
 - Clusters or outbreaks exist that are still likely in their early stages
 - Three Rivers Health Department must rely on assistance to conduct investigation for new cases and contact tracing
- **School Response**
 - K-8 students will report to school; modified schedule may be implemented for high school learners
 - Students screened; any student or staff with symptoms will be temperature checked
 - Students and staff required to wear masks
 - Mask may be required in common areas with social distancing required
 - Meals will be served at school with social distancing as practical

RED: Severe COVID-19 Pandemic Outbreak - Limited use of school facilities

- **Community Definition**
 - Widespread school or community transmission of COVID
 - There is a significant increase in COVID positive cases or percent positive cases which may potentially overwhelm the local healthcare system
 - There is inadequate capacity to conduct investigation and contact tracing
- **School Response**
 - School will close temporarily to clean the buildings and assess the situation
 - E-Learning protocol implemented
 - Modified use of the building will be made for special circumstances
 - Temperature checks will be taken if students and staff receive permission to enter the building



RISK DIAL LEVELS INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL:

GREEN: The “New Normal” risk of COVID-19 spread. The building will be open as usual.

Elementary: Regular school day with measures in place for increased hygiene practices.

High School: Regular 7 period day. Increased hygiene practices.

YELLOW: Moderate risk of COVID-19 spread. The building is opened with minor adjustments.

Elementary: Regular school day in place for elementary students.

High School: Regular 7 period day with measures in place as outlined throughout this document. Other modifications will occur as outlined throughout this document and in conjunction with social distancing when possible.

ORANGE: High Elevated COVID-19 spread risk. Modified use of the facility.

Elementary: Regular school day in place with social distancing as practical. Altered lunch room procedures and other modifications will occur as outlined in this document and in conjunction with the DHM.

High School: Regular school day in place with social distancing as practical. Altered lunch room procedures and other modifications will occur as outlined in this document and in conjunction with the DHM.

RED: Severe COVID-19 pandemic outbreak. Limited use of the facility.

Elementary: E-learning program implemented with limited access to the building and in accordance with the DHM.

High School: E-learning program implemented with limited access to the building and in accordance with the DHM.

OTHER INFORMATION RELATED TO THE CORONAVIRUS

- **Attendance:** Coronavirus-related absenteeism will require verification from school personnel or from a health care facility. Return to school will require a doctor's note or Three Rivers Health verification.
- **Custodial:** Cleaning of door knobs, handles, rails and other items will be done by custodians. Cleanings will occur using electrostatic sprayers owned by the district. Bathrooms will be cleaned throughout the day by custodial staff as needed.
- **Hydration:** Students should use personal water bottles and fill them at the designated bottle filling stations.
- **Facilities:** District facilities are conducive to physical distancing relative to other schools. HVAC upgrades occurred within the last 5 years. The district will modify facility space as needed to allow for physical distancing.

- **Hygiene:** Personal hygiene will be taught and emphasized to all students. Washing of hands several times per day will be encouraged to all students and respiratory etiquette emphasized.
- **Visitors:** The Risk Dial will impact the decision to allow visitors into the building. All visitors to the buildings will need to schedule in advance with the office. A staff member may greet you at the main entrance when possible. Visitors may be required to wear a mask when in the orange or red Risk Dial.
- **Activities:** Extra-curricular activities will be followed in accordance with NSAA guidelines, Three Rivers Health and the Risk Dial at that time.
- **Community Weight Room:** The community weight room is open for the foreseeable future. The Risk Dial will impact the availability of the community weight room.

- **Youth Activities:** Youth activities using NBC facilities may be limited based upon the current Risk Dial. A coach and an additional adult that will be in charge of complying with DHM may be required at each practice/event.
- **Sickness:** Isolation rooms will be created for those individuals feeling sick or displaying symptoms.
- **Communication:** Should someone in the school building test positive for coronavirus, communication will occur with directly impacted families from Three Rivers Health and/or the school. Those families directly impacted by a positive test will be contacted by a health official or the school and the school website will be utilized so all district patrons are made aware of the situation.
- **Lockers:** Students will have use of lockers/cubbies unless otherwise directed.
